## **Reduced Speed Limits Across Rancho Santa Margarita**

**RANCHO SANTA MARGARITA, California** (August 29, 2024) — Speed limits will be reduced across Rancho Santa Margarita.

From now through September, we'll be updating 45 roadway segments with new speed limits, and 19 roadway segments will remain unchanged.

Speed limits are being lowered following an updated engineering and traffic survey (E&TS) that surveyed how fast vehicles travel on our roadways. The last E&TS was completed in 2019.

Since the last update of the City's E&TS, the State has revised the way speed limits can be changed through Assembly Bill 43 (AB43). Previously, cities were constrained to revising the existing speed limits through a process known as the 85th percentile. A speed survey would measure the speed drivers were driving at and the speed limits set to reflect what 85% of drivers were driving at. This was believed to be the safest speed for the roadway segment being studied. Now with adoption of AB43, cities do not have to rely solely on the 85<sup>th</sup> percentile speed. Cities can now use criteria based on the specific conditions and characteristics of the studied roadway segment, such as, roadway geometrics, adjacent land uses, and the presence of vulnerable pedestrian groups and bicyclists.

The goal of reducing motorist travel speeds is to increase reaction time for both drivers and pedestrians to avoid crashes, as the faster the speed, the higher the risk of a severe crash that could lead to serious injuries or deaths.

No speed limits are increasing as a result of the study. The speed limit of the remaining 19 roadway segments will stay the same.

The changes are happening across the city on our arterial and collector streets.

All new speed limits will be going down by 5 mph, with the exception of one roadway segment going down by 10 mph.

As new signs go up and we all get used to new speed limits, Rancho Santa Margarita Police Services will be helping to educate drivers.

For the first 30 days after the new signs are installed Police Services will be issuing warning citation for drivers with excess speeds of 10 mph or less from the new reduced speed limit.

The reduced speed limits is an effort to make streets safe in Rancho Santa Margarita.
